The Collation & Installation of Canons

Almighty God, bless this Cathedral: its life, worship, and witness and make it ever an instrument for the growth of your kingdom. Bless all members of the Cathedral Chapter and Greater Chapter. Give them wisdom and discernment in the promotion of the mission of this Cathedral that it may ever seek to do your will and proclaim the good news of Christ's kingdom with confidence and in the strength of your Holy Spirit; we ask this through Jesus Christ our Lord.

§ Those who are to be Collated come forward and stand before the Bishop who says:

Accept this charge which is both mine and yours, in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit. Amen.

§ The Bishop returns to the Episcopal Chair. Those to be inducted present the Letters Mandatory of the Bishop to the Dean saying together:

> Dean Jason, we present to you Letters Mandatory of Mary, by divine providence Bishop of Llandaff. We ask you as Dean of this Cathedral, to install and induct us into the Quire of this Cathedral Church.

§ The Dean says:

I accept the Letters Mandatory of Bishop Mary, but before I am able to install you, I ask you to make the usual Declaration to defend and preserve the statutes and customs of this Cathedral Church.

§ The new Canons say:

I declare that I will be bound by the Constitution of the Chapter of this Cathedral Church and will faithfully observe all its statutes, ordinances and customs, the Lord being my helper.

- § The Canon Precentor and Canon Chancellor vest the new Canons in their robes.
- § The Dean leads the Canon Trustee to his place and says:

I induct and install you into the Quire of this Cathedral Church, and to the duties and privileges belonging to members of the Cathedral Chapter. May the Lord bless your coming in and your going forth. Amen.

§ The Dean leads the member of Greater Chapter to his place and says:

I induct and install you into the Quire of this Cathedral Church, and to the duties and privileges belonging to members of Greater Chapter. May the Lord bless your coming in and your going forth. Amen.
