The Commission

§ The Archdeacon of Margam, representing the Bishop of Llandaff, stands under the Majestas and addresses the congregation:

These offices carry great responsibility for Mothers' Union, a worldwide organisation whose members seek to express the Christian faith by the transformation of communities worldwide through the promotion of stable marriage, family life and the protection of children.

I now ask the Rev'd Emma Rees-Kenny to come forward.

§ The new Diocesan Chaplain stands before the Archdeacon, who says:

Emma, do you accept the office of Diocesan Chaplain in the Mothers' Union?

§ The new Diocesan Chaplain responds:

I do, the Lord being my helper.

§ The Archdeacon:

Will you serve God in this way, in the firm belief that the power of the Holy Spirit will guide and direct all who call upon Him?

§ The new Diocesan Chaplain:

By putting my trust in him, I will.

§ The Archdeacon:

Emma, I admit you to the office of Diocesan Chaplain, in the name of the Father, and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit. Amen.

§ The outgoing Diocesan President presents the new Diocesan President to the Archdeacon:

Archdeacon, Mrs Jean Starr has been elected to the office of Diocesan President of the Mothers' Union for the Diocese of Llandaff and we ask you to commission her into office for this work.

§ The Archdeacon addresses the new Diocesan President:

The office of Diocesan President of the Mothers' Union is a solemn trust carrying great responsibility. Jean, are you willing to commit yourself to this office and work?

§ The new President responds:

With the help of God, I am.

Will you serve God in this way, in the firm belief that the power of the Holy Spirit will guide and direct all those who call upon him?

President By putting my trust in him, I will.

§ The Archdeacon takes the Diocesan President by the right hand, saying:

Jean, I admit you to the office of Diocesan President for the Diocese of Llandaff, in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. Amen.

§ The Archdeacon addresses the congregation:

I ask you to pray that God will bless his servant Jean and give to her the gifts and powers needed for her work and mission. I invite you to be still, to be aware of God's presence within and around us on this day.

§ The Diocesan President stands before the Archdeacon for the prayer of blessing:

May God the Father, God the Son and God the Holy Spirit, bless, preserve and keep you; may the Lord show his kindness and have mercy on you.

May the Lord watch over you and give you peace.

All Amen.

- § The Badge of Office is presented to the Diocesan President by the Archdeacon.
- § The new Diocesan President presents the new Diocesan Board of Trustees to the Archdeacon:

Josie Bolton, Julie Davies, Jane Fenwick, Marian Godsall, Elizabeth Jones, Sheila Jones, Shawn Lloyd, Pauline Redwood, Ray Saunders, Lyn Evans, and Elaine Campbell-Hopkins have been elected to the office of Mothers' Union Trustees for this diocese. I ask you to commission them to this work.

§ The Archdeacon addresses the trustees:

Are you willing to commit yourselves to this office and work?

§ The trustees respond:

With the help of God, I will.

§ The Archdeacon takes each trustee by the hand in turn and says:

I admit you to the office of Trustee in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. Amen.

§ The Archdeacon addresses the congregation:

I present to you the Diocesan President, Diocesan Chaplain and Trustee board for the Diocese of Llandaff. Will you remember these officeholders in your prayers and give them your support and encouragement?

All We will, in the name of the Lord.

Let us pray:

O God.

we ask that you will bless your servants with a sense of your presence, and knowledge of your constant love. Give wisdom and understanding, your guidance and the humility to accept it. Grant all members the grace to support and uphold all who work in your name; through Jesus Christ our Lord.

All Amen.

§ The Diocesan President leads us in prayer:

Let us all affirm our commitment to the work of Jesus Christ through the Mothers' Union as we say together the Mothers' Union Prayer:

Loving Lord, we thank you for your love so freely given to us all. We pray for families around the world. Bless the work of the Mothers' Union as we seek to share your love through the encouragement, strengthening and support of marriage and family life. Empowered by your Spirit, may we be united in prayer and worship, and in love and service reach out as your hands across the world. In Jesus' name. Amen.
